IRS Mileage Rate Change for Second Half of 2022

Due to rising fuel prices, the IRS made a rare mid-year change to the standard mileage rate for the final 6 months of 2022. The second half of the year will allow an additional 4 cents per mile to be deducted for business and medical purposes. Just as before, taxpayers still have the option of calculating the actual costs of using their vehicles instead of using the standard mileage rates. Since the rate is different from the first half of the year to the second half, if you plan to make use of the standard mileage rate, this means you need to keep track of both halves of the year separately.

IRS Sent Erroneous Notices

The IRS acknowledged some taxpayers are receiving CP-14 notices that incorrectly state a balance is due. Most of the errors arose from a spouse that made a joint payment from their individual online account. The IRS says that taxpayers who know they paid all their tax due should ignore the notice at this time. If they did not pay their tax balance, they should pay the remaining balance or contact the IRS about payment options. Any assessed penalties and interest will be automatically adjusted after payments are correctly applied. As always, you are welcome to give us a copy of any notices you receive for us to review.

Did You Know?

From 1784 to 1811, citizens of Britain were required to pay a tax on their hats. As a way of taxing according to status, cheaper hats paid less tax, and fancier hats were taxed at a higher rate. To prove they paid the tax, a stamp was pasted or imprinted on the inside of the hat. If the hat police caught you wearing a hat without a stamp, you'd be heavily fined. In 1798, a man named John Collins was caught using a printing press to forge the stamps, which would allow people to cheat on the tax. For such forgery, he was sentenced to death. They did not abide tax evasion.
